## Michael Rubin

Michael Rubin is a resident scholar in foreign and defense policy studies at AEI. Rubin's major research area is the Middle East, with special focus on Iran, Iraq, Turkey, and Kurdish society. He also writes frequently on transformative diplomacy and governance issues. At AEI, Rubin chaired the "Dissent and Reform in the Arab World" conference series. He also is lead drafter of the Bipartisan Policy Center's special report on Iran. In

addition to his work at AEI, several times each month, Rubin travels to military bases across the U.S. and Europe to instruct senior U.S. Army and Marine officers deploying to Iraq and Kuwait on issues relating to regional state history and politics, Shiism, the theological basis of extremism, and strategy. He received a BS in biology and an MA and a PhD in history from Yale University.
