With over twenty years of experience focusing on nuclear weapons policy and arms control in the field of national security affairs, Kerry M. Kartchner has served in such positions as senior representative of the U.S. Department of State to the U.S. Component of the Standing Consultative Commission (for the ABM Treaty) in Geneva, Switzerland, in the Office of Strategic and Theater Missile Defense in the Bureau of Arms Control, and as a senior advisor to bureau and department leadership regarding deterrence and strategic arms control issues. In May 2003, he was co-chair of a conference for Latter-day Saint national security professionals held in Washington, D.C., at the Milton A. Barlow Center. From 1986 to 1990, Kartchner worked as an assistant professor in the Department of National Security Affairs at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California, where he taught courses on nuclear strategy and targeting, arms control, international relations, U.S.–Soviet relations, and NATO security. He is the author of such recent publications as “Origins of the ABM Treaty,” in *Rockets’ Red Glare: Missile Defense and the Future of World Politics* (2001), and “Beyond the ABM Treaty: The Future of the Offense-Defense Relationship,” to be published in *Arms Control: Cooperative Security in a Changing Environment* (forthcoming from Lynne Rienner). Kartchner received a bachelor’s degree in international relations from BYU and master’s and doctoral degrees, both in international relations with emphases in foreign policy analysis and strategic studies, from the University of Southern California.
