ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF POLITICAL SCIENCE, UNIVERSITY OF ANTWERP

Cas Mudde, associate professor of political science at the University of Antwerp, is a visiting fellow at the Kellogg Institute for International Studies at Notre Dame. Mudde's research agenda has centered on the relationship between political extremism and democracy in Europe. His project "To the Left? To the Right? Explaining Populism(s) in Europe and Latin America," plans to differentiate and evaluate different types of populism, and he will attempt to explain why right-wing populism

has been successful in Europe while left-wing populism dominates Latin America. The author of *Populist Radical Right Parties in Europe* (Cambridge University Press, 2007), which was a Choice Outstanding Academic Title and Stein Rokkan Prize winner, and the *Ideology of the Extreme Right* (Manchester University Press, 2000), he has edited or coedited five books, and published over twenty-five peer-reviewed journal articles. Mudde received a PhD from the University of Leiden.
