Krzysztof Pomian is currently an honorary director of research at the Centre national de la recherche scientifique (CNRS) and a professor at the University Nicolas Copernic in Torun, Poland. In 2001, Pomian was named the scientific director of the Museum of Europe in Brussels and was responsible for designing the collection and conceptualizing the historical view of Europe it seeks to project. An author of numerous important books on museums, collecting, relics, Europe, philosophy and historiography, he has been awarded several prestigious prizes, honorary doctorates, and guest lectureships. Born in Warsaw, Poland, he received a PhD at the University of Warsaw, but for political reasons, he emigrated to France in 1973, where he has spent most of his career at CNRS. Pomian has also taught at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en sciences sociales (EHESS), at the Ecole du Louvre, and at the University of Geneva.
