Kenley Butler, executive officer and senior project manager at the James Martin Center for Nonproliferation Studies since 2000, has written on proliferation threats in the former Soviet Union, nuclear proliferation networks, and export controls, specifically as associate editor-in-chief of the *NIS Export Control Observer*. Butler also coordinates the development of online material on WMD proliferation for the Nuclear Threat Initiative (<http://www.nti.org>). He previously spent two years as an international

trade specialist with the U.S. Commercial Service, served with the first group of Peace Corps volunteers in Uzbekistan, and conducted research on the privatization of Kazakhstan's telecommunications infrastructure at Almaty State University. Butler received a BA in Russian with a business minor from Brigham Young University and an MPA from the University of Washington, where he specialized in economics of the former Soviet Union.
