Meltdown: The Inside Story of the North Korean Nuclear Crisis

Mike Chinoy is the Edgerton Fellow on Korean Security at the Pacific Council on International Policy in Los Angeles, focusing on security issues in North Korea, China, and northeast Asia. Chinoy had been a foreign correspondent for CNN for twenty-four years. His latest book, *Meltdown: The Inside Story of the North Korean Nuclear Crisis* (2008), was hailed by the *Washington Post* as a “tour de force of reporting.” He is also the author of *China Live: People Power and the Television Revolution* (1999) and *China Live: Two decades in the Heart of the Dragon* (1997). During a thirty-year career in broadcast journalism, Chinoy worked in London, Beijing, and Hong Kong, among other locations. His coverage of Tiananmen Square in 1989 earned him CableACE, DuPont, and Peabody awards. Other awards include a silver medal from the New York Film Festival and Asian Television Awards for his reporting in Indonesia and Taiwan. Chinoy received a BA in Chinese studies from Yale University and an MA from Columbia University’s Graduate School of Journalism.
