

# ROME

## INTERNSHIPS 2021



Rome has delighted visitors for centuries since its legendary founding in 753 BCE. The capital city boasts the splendors of Roman antiquity, the remarkable art and architecture of Michelangelo and Bernini, the grandeur of Vatican City, fine modern art, exciting open-air events, music festivals, delicious food and gelato, and the brand new LDS temple. The Rome Internship Program offers BYU students the opportunity to live and work in the “eternal city,” experiencing firsthand how twenty-first century life intermingles with the layers of an ancient past. Students may request internships in their individual fields of interest. Past interns have worked in marketing, engineering, athletic training, cinedubbing, museums, a dental clinic, and with refugees teaching English and Italian. To supplement your work experience, this program also offers a weekly refresher language course, two cooking classes, and a study of Italian history, art, and architecture with visits to the catacombs, Colosseum, Roman Forum, Galleria Borghese, St. Peter’s, the Sistine Chapel, and a 3-day stay in Florence where we will climb to the top of the Duomo, and see the David, the Uffizi, Palazzo Pitti, and Boboli Gardens.

### **DATES**

Spring Term: 26 April – 19 June 2021 (8 weeks)

### **HOUSING**

Housing in Rome will be with Italian families, preferably with two students to a family. Families will provide breakfasts and dinners. Living with a host family is a cultural experience. Special dietary needs may not be accommodated in host families.

### **COURSES**

Students will be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours during the program in the following courses:

Required: ITAL 363 Italian culture (3 credit hours)

Required: ITAL 399R Academic Internship—Italian Language Field Experience (3 credit hours)

Participants may not take any other courses on this program, including BYU Online courses, without approval by the program director and ISP.

### **COST**

\$6400-6900

This includes: BYU LDS undergraduate tuition, housing, breakfast and dinner, and international health insurance coverage. It also includes a 3-day stay in Florence as well as all museum entrances in Rome and Florence. This does not include: international airfare, some meals (lunch), personal expenses, or passport.

### **TRAVEL**

Students are responsible for purchasing their own airfare to and from the program. Airfare reservations must be made through BYU Travel. Students should contact a BYU Travel agent at:

### **PREPARATION**

Students must have completed ITAL 201 prior to departure for the program.

Accepted students are required to participate in HCOLL 396R sec 2 for 1 credit hour, an international preparation course held Thursdays from 5:00 to 6:50 p.m. during second block of winter semester.

Accompanying spouses of students need to be credit-bearing participants on the program. Spouses will also need to apply online, take the preparation course, and pay for a minimum number of BYU credits and international health insurance coverage.

### **FUNDING SOURCES**

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs. Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for a Study Abroad scholarship.

Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants. Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see [kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships](http://kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships)).

The College of Humanities may have funding specifically for majors in that college. Please check with Jennifer Haraguchi for details.

### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Students must be adults 18 years-of-age or older.

The application requires a \$35 fee.

Applicants will be interviewed once the application is complete.

Students will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program.
