

CONTEMPORARY DANCE IN EUROPE

STUDY ABROAD SUMMER 2019



Connect to global trends and trendsetters in Contemporary Dance through the Current Trends in Contemporary Dance Study Abroad program, presented by the BYU Department of Dance in summer 2019. Over a six-week period, participants will take classes from a dynamic roster of instructors at major international contemporary dance festivals in Vienna, Berlin, Prague and Amsterdam. Guest lectures and panelists, along with visits to major historical sites and museums, will inform student choreography exploring aesthetic, social and political trends in dance. Students will also experience dance as a site of community engagement and social change through exchange with nonprofit organizations. Participants will become more self-aware and articulate artist-citizens, with skills and knowledge to engage with the field of dance from a more global perspective.

DATES

15 June–27 July 2019 (approximate)

HOUSING

Students will stay in hotels, hostels and student residence halls in Amsterdam, Vienna, Prague and Berlin.

COURSES

Students must register for a minimum of 6 credit hours during the summer term.

Required:

DANCE 359R Special Topics and Issues: Current Trends in Contemporary Dance (2 credit hours)

DANCE 540 Advanced Dance Technique Workshop in a Studio Setting (2 credit hours)

DANCE 544 Advanced Studio Workshop (2 credit hours): May substitute for DANCE 362 Intermediate Composition

Students may not take any other courses on this program, including BYU Online courses, without approval by the program director and ISP.

COST

\$6,800-7,300

Includes LDS, undergraduate full tuition (increased cost for graduate and non-LDS students), lodging, transportation, some meals and admissions, dance technique classes, and international health insurance coverage.

Not Included: airfare to and from Europe, some meals, some local transportation, and personal expenses.

PREPARATION

To apply for this program, students should have completed DANCE 243/244R. Students will be selected by interview and audition.

Students are also required to participate in an international, cross-cultural preparation course (IAS 201R, 1 credit hour). This evening course will be held during the second block of winter semester 2019. All students should also be enrolled in a technique class during winter 2019.

FUNDING SOURCES

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs.

Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for a study abroad scholarship and may be considered for other scholarships. Students *must indicate on their original online application* that they want to be considered for financial aid.

Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants.

Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships).

APPLICATION PROCESS

Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/apply. The application requires a \$35 fee.

Applicants will be interviewed once the application is complete.

Students will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program.
