He has also served on several national professional boards and organizations for Korean language teaching. Clay has been studying Korean since his mission to South Korea in 1973. He has a BA in Humanities from Brigham Young University and an MA in North Korean Studies from Sogang University in Seoul, Korea; he also did additional graduate studies in Korean linguistics at the University of Hawaii.
