

EUROPE BUSINESS & LAW

STUDY ABROAD FALL 2022



This immersive semester-long European study abroad will be a life-changing adventure. The program is geared toward students who are interested in enhancing their understanding of global businesses and the legal and cultural environments they operate in. We will use Milan, Italy as a base for explorations of business, law, and culture throughout Italy, France, Switzerland, Germany, San Marino, the Czech Republic, and Greece. Fall promises to be particularly vibrant, as Milan will be alive with great opera, concerts, and festivals. Inside Italy we will make business, legal, and cultural visits to Venice, Florence, Rome, Pompeii, Lake Como, and Cinque Terre. Outside Italy, we will visit historical, cultural, and religious sites throughout Europe, including the Louvre, the Eiffel Tower, Versailles, Lake Geneva, the Swiss Alps, the Berlin Wall, Prague Castle, and the Acropolis. We will also be visiting top multinational companies and organizations like Microsoft, Amazon, Nestle, Accenture, PwC, EY, United Nations, World Trade Organization, Deutsche Bank, and Ferrari, as well as scrappy tech start-ups. The program will include working on a live project with a company in Italy, which will be a great addition to your resume.

HOUSING

Students will reside and take classes in the city of Milan. As Italy's center for business, fashion, design, and art, and home to some of the most beautiful architecture in Europe, Milan is a walkable and safe city, with Leonardo da Vinci's last supper, the Duomo, and La Scala Opera House. Students will stay in hotels or youth hostels during scheduled trips in locations convenient to our planned business and cultural visits.

COURSES

Students will receive 12 credits, which can fulfill major/minor requirements in business or count as general hours toward graduation. All students will take the same four courses (options are available if you have already taken one or two of the courses):

- MSB 430: Intro to International Business (3 credits, Professor Shad Morris). Fulfills requirements for Global Business and Literacy, Entrepreneurial Management, General Studies: Management, European Studies, Global Supply Chain Management, Human Resource Management, Accounting, Localization, Mechanical Engineering, Strategy.
- HRM 401/391 Organizational Effectiveness (3 credits, Professor Shad Morris). Fulfills requirements for Accounting, Business Management, Entrepreneurial Management, Experience and Design Management, Finance, Global Supply Chain Management, Human Resource Management, Information Systems, Marketing, Strategic Management.

- ACC 241 Business Law in the Environment (3 credits, Professors Gladriel Shobe and Jarrod Shobe). Fulfills requirements for Accounting, Business Management, Entrepreneurial Management, Finance, Global Supply Chain Management, Human Resource Management, Marketing, Strategic Management.
- MSB 490R Business Projects (3 credits, Jonathon Wood and Shad Morris). Fulfills elective requirements.

COST

\$9,800–10,300

Includes full-time Latter-Day Saint undergraduate tuition (costs higher for graduate and non-Latter-Day Saint students); housing in Milan and while on all scheduled trips in Italy and throughout Europe; admission to program-related museums and historical sites; transportation within Europe for all scheduled trips; all breakfasts and some dinners on scheduled trips outside Milan; and international health insurance coverage.

Does not include airfare to/from the U.S. (estimated at \$1,200), meals in Milan, personal expenses, and passport.

TRAVEL

Students are responsible for purchasing their own airfare to and from the program sites. Airfare reservations must be made through BYU Travel. Students should contact a BYU Travel agent.

PREPARATION

All accepted students must also register for IAS 201R (1 credit), a required pre-departure preparation course to be taught by the Professor Morris and Professors Shobe. This evening course will be held during the second block of winter semester 2022. Accompanying spouses need to be credit-bearing participants on the program. Spouses will also need to apply online and take the preparation course.

All participants are required to show proof of complete COVID-19 vaccination (including booster) at least two weeks prior to departure.

FUNDING SOURCES

BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs. BYU students are strongly encouraged to request experiential education funding through their home department and/or college and the ORCA program. Those who complete the financial aid section of the ISP application and file a current FAFSA form at BYU's Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will also be considered for a need-based study abroad scholarship. Students may also pursue private grants and scholarships, including those listed online at kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/apply. A nonrefundable \$35 application fee is required.
